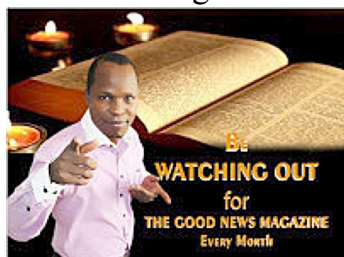


Hello and Welcome

That's why Jesus Himself commanded us to love each other. John 13:34 says, *A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another.* Jesus our best friend, did not only come down from heaven, and lay aside His glory and royal majesty, but He laid down His life! He could have laid down His gold, silver and the riches of this world, which were all His, but He opted to lay down His very own life; than which, nothing is dearer to a man, is Himself, His all, everything He was! That indeed is a friend we all need to have!

Jesus was and still is the Lord of glory and Prince of life. He was crucified and slain. We deserved all this, but He, being a good and caring friend gave it all for our own sake. His life had never been forfeited by sin, nor could it have been forced away from Him by men but it was laid down of and by Himself, freely and voluntarily. He became a ransom for us. Jesus, being our surety and substitute, stood in our legal place and took our sins upon Him. He bore the curse of the law with all the punishment due to sin; and suffered death, the death of the

cross. How painful this was for a dear friend to lay down His life for us. It is not that He was a sinner, we were and He was sinless, just and upright.

Notice, Jesus didn't want to call His disciples servants, but He called them friends. Not that they were originally so; being enemies and enmity itself to God, when He laid down His life for them and for us all. God's main agenda is to reconcile and bring us back to Himself. We, who were His enemies by His grace called us friends. He laid down His life for His enemies, without any sinister or selfish move, Jesus freely and voluntarily died on the cross for us ALL. Proverb 18:24 *A man that hath friends must shew himself friendly: and there is a friend that sticketh closer than a brother.* That friend is Jesus who will always stick closer to us. Who is like Him? Will you allow Him to come into your life? Will you let Jesus be part of your life? *Behold, I stand at the door, and knock: if any man hear my voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with me.* Let us all open the door of our hearts and let Jesus in. He is indeed a friend who can give His life for a friend. Will you?

Friendships are important. Not just to us as humans, but even throughout scripture, we're shown examples of friendships. My favorite was the true friendship love between Jonathan & David. So much so, that we named one of our sons Jonathan David! The struggles they had to go to just in order to be able to meet together, the risks Jonathan took to even see David when he knew his father was seeking to kill him. But they had a friendship that even those fears couldn't keep apart. True friendship.

I believe that we take friendships for granted. We have the friends that can do for us and that's when they're our friends. Otherwise, we really don't have too much contact. Then there are the friends that we don't hear from them until they need something from us. There are friends that when you meet for the first time, you instantly click and grows into life-long friendships. That is true friendship.

To have someone, that when your heart is burdened about something, to be able to pick up the phone, or write and pour your heart out to them and them alone knowing they're not going to critique what you share, but prayerfully take before the Lord with you, and seek Godly advice to share back with you, encourage you, cry with you, rejoice with you. These friends are hard to find. But is a true blessing once found. For they are the ones that would do what seems to be impossible for you.

The Bible gives us many examples of not only WHAT kind of friend to look for, but the benefits of a true friend, how you know if they are a true friend, and how to keep that friend.

We're told right in Proverbs 18:24 - *"A man that hath friends must shew himself friendly."*

Absolutely! A true friendship is give and take.

Not one of us is perfect. Even the best of friends, when asked, I'm sure can point out flaws in our characters. Perhaps one we're not aware of, perhaps some we're working on. However, if we prove ourselves to be friendly through thick and thin, it does tend to bring the bond closer together. Does that mean we'll never disappoint? By no means. It means that we do our best to be friendly towards others, and they will either respond in kind, or turn the other way not looking for true friendship. A good verse backing this up is Proverbs 17:17 - *A friend loveth at all times,*" Not just when its been a good day, or everything has gone right. But even when we mess up, have a bad day, hurt them verbally (intentionally or unintentionally). Do we hold a grudge toward them and punish them with our silence when they come to us with an apology? Or perhaps never apologize at all? They may not have realized they even hurt or offended us. But they are our true friend.; And we should love them at ALL times.

True friends also do something to each other. Its like putting two halves together when they are together. They compliment each other. Proverbs 27:17 - *" Iron sharpeneth iron; so a man*

sharpeneth the countenance of his friend.". Best friends, true friends, just bring out the best in each other. True friends are not afraid to confront a friend with an issue they may see going in a wrong direction. Because they love them, they may need to share some painful things with them. Hearing those things may be even more painful than the person sharing them. However, a true friend is going to listen, and then "hear" what the friend is saying as they are not one in the same. You can listen to music in the background and hum along subconsciously. But hearing is taking in every word, and pondering it. Praying about it, even praying together about it. In the end, if its a true friendship, you will both come out stronger than before. That is why we are told in Proverbs 27:6 -" *Faithful [are] the wounds of a friend; but the kisses of an enemy [are] deceitful.*" There are many types of friendships, but the one true one is the most important. We're told in the latter part of Proverbs 18:24, "...and there is a friend [that] sticketh closer than a brother." We all have access to this Friend, if we choose to. That is Jesus Christ! He's as close as a whispered prayer away. Once you have found and yielded your life over to Him, He IS that friend that will NEVER desert you, turn away from you, leave you alone in the darkness of night when you're heart is so heavily burdened. He knows us, He loves us, and He cares for us in a way that our earthly friends may fall short at times. He will not! We're assured of this in John 15:13 – *"Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life*

for his friends." Jesus Christ was this man. While He walked this earth, He was man and God. Yet it was His humanity that He offered freely, without hesitation, for His friends...that we may be with Him always even into eternity. And yes, while Jesus was here on earth, it is mentioned in scripture that He was a friend to all, and yet, He had a couple of "best friends". One we know was Lazarus. John 11 conveys this in vs.3 *"Therefore his sisters sent unto him, saying, Lord, behold, he whom thou lovest is sick."* And again in vs. 5 *"Now Jesus loved Martha, and her sister, and Lazarus."* While Jesus had a plan, and knew what His Father wanted Him to do, in the eyes of the disciples, Jesus was taking a great risk for these friends as we read in vs. 7 *"Then after that saith he to his disciples, Let us go into Judaea again. 8 His disciples say unto him, Master, the Jews of late sought to stone thee; and goest thou thither again?"* But that didn't stop Him. We continue reading and it says, *"after that he saith unto them, Our friend Lazarus sleepeth; "* So we see that while here on earth, He did have friends...and He saw His friend die. And it effected Him, we know, as one of the most popularly quoted verses because of it being the shortest verse in scripture is because, *"Jesus wept"*. Even though He knew He was going to raise Lazarus from the dead, it pained Jesus so, that He wept. When Jesus tells us He knows all that we've been through, every pain, every emotion we feel, its because He did while here on earth; Everything but sin. That is why He was able to be that One and only special Friend who could

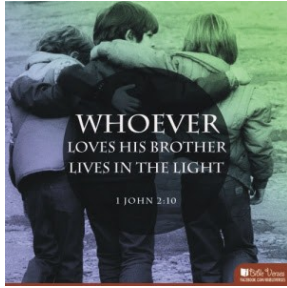
lay down His life for a friend. On the cross of Calvary, He laid down His life for you and me. Not because we were friends with Him, but because He was friends with ALL. My friend, and I do consider you a friend, perhaps not a "best friend", but a friend enough to lovingly share with you this crucial fact. have played a big role in our lives

2Corinthians 11 (KJV)

**1** Would to God ye could bear with me a little in my folly: and indeed bear with me. **2** For I am jealous over you with godly jealousy: for I have espoused you to one husband, that I may present you as a chaste virgin to Christ. **3** But I fear, lest by any means, as the serpent beguiled Eve through his subtilty, so your minds should be corrupted from the simplicity that is in Christ. **4** For if he that cometh preacheth another Jesus, whom we have not preached, or if ye receive

another spirit, which ye have not received, or another gospel, which ye have not accepted, ye might well bear with him. 5 For I suppose I was not a whit behind the very chieftest apostles. 6 But though I be rude in speech, yet not in knowledge; but we have been thoroughly made manifest among you in all things. 7 Have I committed an offence in abasing myself that ye might be exalted, because I have preached to you the gospel of God freely? 8 I robbed other churches, taking wages of them, to do you service. 9 And when I was present with you, and wanted, I was chargeable to no man: for that which was lacking to me the brethren which came from Macedonia supplied: and in all things I have kept myself from being burdensome unto you, and so will I keep myself. 10 As the truth of Christ is in me, no man shall stop me of this boasting in the regions of Achaia. 11 Wherefore? because I love you not? God knoweth. 12 But what I do, that I will do, that I may cut off occasion from them which desire occasion; that wherein they glory, they may be found even as we. 13 For such are false apostles, deceitful workers, transforming themselves into the apostles of Christ. 14 And no marvel; for Satan himself is transformed into an angel of light. 15 Therefore it is no great thing if his ministers also be transformed as the ministers of righteousness; whose end shall be according to their works. 16 I say again, Let no man think me a fool; if otherwise, yet as a fool receive me, that I may boast myself a little. 17 That which I speak, I speak it not after the Lord, but as it were foolishly, in this confidence of boasting. 18

Seeing that many glory after the flesh, I will glory also. 19 For ye suffer fools gladly, seeing ye yourselves are wise. 20 For ye suffer, if a man bring you into bondage, if a man devour you, if a man take of you, if a man exalt himself, if a man smite you on the face. 21 I speak as concerning reproach, as though we had been weak. Howbeit whereinsoever any is bold, (I speak foolishly,) I am bold also. 22 Are they Hebrews? so am I. Are they Israelites? so am I. Are they the seed of Abraham? so am I. 23 Are they ministers of Christ? (I speak as a fool) I am more; in labours more abundant, in stripes above measure, in prisons more frequent, in deaths oft. 24 Of the Jews five times received I forty stripes save one. 25 Thrice was I beaten with rods, once was I stoned, thrice I suffered shipwreck, a night and a day I have been in the deep; 26 In journeyings often, in perils of waters, in perils of robbers, in perils by mine own countrymen, in perils by the heathen, in perils in the city, in perils in the wilderness, in perils in the sea, in perils among false brethren; 27 In weariness and painfulness, in watchings often, in hunger and thirst, in fastings often, in cold and nakedness. 28 Beside those things that are without, that which cometh upon me daily, the care of all the churches. 29 Who is weak, and I am not weak? who is offended, and I burn not? 30 If I must needs glory, I will glory of the things which concern mine infirmities. 31 The God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, which is blessed for evermore, knoweth that I lie not. 32 In Damascus the governor under Aretas the king kept the city of the Damascenes

with a garrison, desirous to apprehend me: 33 And through a window in a basket was I let down by the wall, and escaped his hands.
