All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness:

=1) God wants us to become grounded in the understanding, teaching, and use of scripture; that's the doctrine (rules) and instruction (learning) categories. =2) Equally important, He wants us to be clear and responsible in (Continued on pg 5)

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Do You Take Your Rock With You?

I'm sure you are familiar with the story of Moses, and his message from the Lord through a burning bush, telling him to go to Egypt. (Exodus 3) The purpose for this, was to set free God's people, the Israelites, from captivity. Moses felt unworthy, unable, and "not the man to do the job." However, he obeyed the Lord, went to Pharaoh, and pleaded for their release. Moses was rejected many times with great hostility. However, upon instruction of the Lord, Moses went back each time the Lord told him to, until finally, Pharaoh agreed to let God's people go.

Here is where we will pick up in scripture exactly what the Lord commanded Moses to do; Exodus 13:17-22 ~

And it came to pass, when Pharaoh had let the people go, that God led them not through the way of the land of the Philistines, although that was near; for God said, Lest peradventure the people repent when they see war, and they return to Egypt: But God led the people about, through the way of the wilderness of the Red sea: and the children of Israel went up harnessed out of the land of Egypt. And Moses took the bones of Joseph with him: for he had straitly sworn the children of Israel, saying, God will surely visit you; and ye shall carry up my bones away hence with you. And they took their journey from

Succoth, and encamped in Etham, in the edge of the wilderness. And the LORD went before them by day in a pillar of a cloud, to lead them the way; and by night in a pillar of

fire, to give them light; to go by day and night: He took not away the pillar of the cloud by day, nor the

pillar of fire by night, from before the people.

But that was not all the Lord provided for them.

Here is where it get's interesting!

If you continue reading on to the book of Numbers, chapter 20, you will see that the Lord not only provided them with food, direction, and most important, stressed that what He commanded should be done THE WAY the Lord says He wants things done. He still provided water for them and their animals in spite of their constant complaining and NOT doing things exactly as the Lord commanded them to do. In verses 7-12:

And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying, Take the rod, and gather thou the assembly together, thou, and Aaron thy brother, and speak ye unto the rock before their eyes; and it shall give forth his water, and thou shalt bring forth to them water out of the rock: so thou shalt give the congregation and their beasts drink. And Moses took the rod from before the LORD, as he commanded him. And Moses and Aaron gathered the congregation together before the rock, and he said unto them, Hear now, ye rebels; must we fetch you water out of this rock? And Moses lifted

up his hand, and with his rod he smote the rock twice: and the water came out abundantly, and the congregation drank, and their beasts also. And the LORD spake

unto Moses and Aaron,
Because ye believed me not,
to sanctify me in the eyes of
the children of Israel,
therefore ye shall not bring
this congregation into the
land which I have given them.

The Lord's desire was to bless His people and give them a beautiful land that was their own, full of peace and all things needed to provide for them. But because they didn't do exactly what the Lord said and the way He said to do it, there were consequences to be paid.

I believe that many times, we feel that because we admit that we've made a mistake (sinned against God) and He is so forgiving, there are no consequences to be paid. This is not true or Biblical! We can be forgiven, and our sin forgotten by the Lord, and yet, we must still pay the consequences as we see here.

Those consequences did not mean the Lord was done dealing with them, or that He loved them any less. And it doesn't mean He had ceased looking out for them, as He was....

In ways that just blow my mind, have the scriptures shown evidence of His constant watchcare over them the entire time they were in the wilderness. My mind had to keep searching to be sure I wasn't being misled, or misleading anyone, once I really understood it.

Referring to this same account, lets now see what the

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New Testament has to say about this. I Corinthians 10:1-12 is where we are going to look next. And we need to be very careful as to HOW we read this passage as we can either blow right past it, or have our eyes opened for the first time and really be blown away.

Moreover, brethren, I would not that ye should be ignorant, how that all our fathers were under the cloud, and all passed through the sea; And were all baptized unto Moses in the cloud and in the sea; And did all eat the same spiritual meat; And did all drink the same spiritual drink: for they drank of that spiritual Rock that followed them: and the Rock was Christ.

In the first passage, we read how the Lord told Moses to speak to the rock and it would give lifesustaining water. Reading this passage from 1 Corinthians 10, something supernatural takes place; That rock was not merely a rock...that Rock was Jesus Christ... Capital Rock! At first hearing/seeing this, I went right past it. But the more you cross reference, every place in this account, the lower case "r" was used for rock. Until we get to the New Testament, and the Lord reveals to us, that Rock was Jesus! Jesus, the son of God, was with the Israelites all through the wilderness. Leading them, directing them, guiding them, and even providing water for them. I also find it fascinating that in the Garden of Gethsemane, when Jesus knew He was going to be crucified and was praying to the Father,

I have given them thy word; and the world hath hated them, because they are not of the world, even as I am not of the world. I pray not that thou shouldest take them out of the world, but that thou shouldest keep them from the evil. John 17:14,15

That is exactly what He did for God's children. He, Jesus was the Rock that followed them.. watching over them.

So yes, my friend, Jesus is my Rock. I take Him everywhere I go. I call on Him morning, noon, & night. When heartache is too much to handle, when pain can no longer be managed, when things never seem to work out and you just feel like you can't go on any further, make sure you are grounded to the Rock, and that Rock is Jesus!

Heaven's Computer Connection by Gramps

The FUN IS GROWING! And I CAN HARDLY WAIT!

Last time we learned that computers

are fun for students AND silverhaired folks, alike. Especially when the computers are free, and don't need batteries or special rules to make them work.

Did you try the contest with a junk keyboard? It's FUN!
But it gets even more fun, when you discover the computer manual that is just perfect for it. We'll get to that in a little bit.

The key thing to remember is that we're connecting youth, silver-haired seniors, non-technical computers, and especially our Savior and Lord. Jesus Christ.

We'd better show how

simple this kind of computing is, by listing just 5 things we need to remember about computing – that's it; one for each right-handed finger. Watch how simple.

- =1) God gave computers to us to responsibly use them to magnify Him.
- =2) The best guide for computing, by far, is our Bible. The Bible guarantees it! [Details later]=3) The Holy Spirit has computer teaching skills beyond our imagination.
- =4) Kids of every age love them!=5) The most powerful computers come from the trash and don't need batteries.

Before we go further, you really must go back and review our 5 new guidelines. Take some real quiet time in getting GROUNDED in their purpose.

Now on our left hand, one

finger stands alone with the purpose for which we'll use the computer fingers on the other hand.

That big goal; that target,

is to demonstrate to youth how to really listen. This kind of listening grows from down deep within us; down deep where our real tears are made. This bone-deep listening we're talking about, is listening you almost do with a fork.

Yes, it sounds silly; **listening with a fork**. Let's see what this means.

When we sit down to the table for a yummy meal, we don't grab a fork and dive in. We begin with heads bowed and thank God for the food He's provided, and then we ask Him to strengthen and guide us in how we serve Him –



with that strength.

And THEN we pick up our fork feed ourselves, thinking of what His will is for us.

In that same way, we need to listen to others with the same respect and gratitude as at table grace. Listening with a fork means we bone-deep focus – no, FEED on what the other person is telling us. We'll want their voice to sink deep in our heart that we will most-lovingly be an ongoing trusted friend of theirs (just like Jesus is, ours.)

Listening – that bone-deep listening is a skill that is neither understood or practiced, today. It isn't used in the classroom, home, in front of the pulpit, and especially not in our personal prayer time.

The Heaven's Computer Connection of the Good News Magazine, each month seeks to explain the power and purpose of that bone-deep listening — in two ways that both involve youth. The first purpose is to attract youth to bone-deep listening to God's Written Word — our Bible.

Our second way of listening, will help awaken the spirit and first love of our senior generation, by bone-deep listening to the world of our youth, and seeing the boys and girls discover there are people; church people that really care – really LISTEN to them, and all their unanswered questions about life.

The Bulls-Eye goal we are aiming at, is showing our readers, and their churches, how not to become a church described like the church of Ephesus, in Revelation chapter 2. Verse 4 accuses the church of leaving its FIRST LOVE.

The recommendation is to

Remember therefore from whence thou art fallen, and repent.
Our own spirit of love for our dear Savior, is awakened as we bonedeep listen to the hearts of our youth, and demonstrate how to bone-deep listen to God's voice to each of us – through His Word.

Ask the Lord to put the name of a young person on your heart. Write their name on a piece of paper. Lay that name on your open Bible as you pray. See your spirit awaken as you help that boy or girl learn through you what first love is, make the connection.

evaluating our character and conduct (reproof). Linked to that reproof, is being grounded in the correction (discipline) that draws us back to the path that honors God and attracts others to His will.

We want, here, to show the levels of man's disobedience, and the levels of God's correction. The hope is to change parental cautions (to their children) into strong warnings toward cheerful obedience. Let's begin with a home-made parable. (A parable is a simple earthly story that teaches a heavenly truth.)

A Parable of Disobedience (getting grounded)

A father disciplines his 3 disobedient children, by confining them to their room until he gives permission to come out. (In today's

terms it's called, 'getting GROUNDED'). His warning is also that if they go elsewhere than their room, the discipline will be much worse. And if they remain firm where they stand, the discipline will be far more severe.

The result in this parable is that one child obediently goes to his room, the second goes to the living room and plays with some computer toy. The third child is totally defiant to the father, continuing to do just what (s)he was doing, right where (s)he was. The father disciplined each, according to their actions.

God Disciplining His Children.

The actual events in Bible history, of God disciplining His children (nation of Israel; Judah) are found mostly in the Old Testament book of Jeremiah. "their room" would be comparable to Babylon; "living room" to Egypt, and "right where they were" to Jerusalem.

Because Israel;Judah continually disobeyed observing His offerings and commands, God gave them His "go to your room" opportunity to get back on the right track in Jer. 19:8-13.

Then, in 21:8,9 God gives them His 'life or death' choice. The Jews that obeyed God and 'willingly' went into captivity would be allowed to have vineyards, cattle, and growing families... and someday be able to return to their homeland. 29:4-7.

But many of the Jews showed they were staying on their downhill disobedient course of living, by traveling to Egypt (the 'living room'). While in Egypt, the women burned incense to other gods, the men knew it, and allowed it. Jeremiah 44:26-29 tells us they

died by the sword and starvation.

So when God tells us we are to 'go to our room', we'd better cheerfully obey, and quick.

WARNING! The following may not be suitable for young ears!

The third group of Jews, didn't adhere to God's 'go-to-your-room' discipline and travel to Babylon. They remained right where they were, the way they were. Very simply, (according to God's warning) the city of Jerusalem was surrounded by the enemy and the literal fulfillment of God's warning, way back in chapter 19:8,9 occurred.

How far can man's unconfessed sin and outright defiance of God ultimately carry him? How far does God's mercy reach, before His wrath of 'correction' causes indescribable treatment of one's own children, (in-family cannibalism) and then death. Lamentations 4:1-10.

So, then, what does God want from us?

=1) Be fully grounded (committed) to our Rock of Salvation, His mercy, peace, purpose, and provision, as we feed on God's precious protected word.

=2) As leaders, in our homes and church families, we must also teach by word and example - responsibility, accountability, and their consequences.

We can see the consequences of sin (our sin) born on the body and character of an innocent Lamb; God's Lamb – Jesus Christ.

For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting

life. John 3:16 = = =
